I attended **Boston University** School of Fine Arts in the early 1970s. My goal was a career playing bass trombone in an orchestra. I ended up creating home entertainment electronics. But along the way, I still got to play in some outstanding orchestra and chamber music groups.

I especially remember when Henryk Szeryng conducted our **BU** Orchestra. He was a violin soloist and conductor of the greatest talent. He gave all of us playing a glimpse of what it would be like to perform for a career.

While at **BU**, I performed in many times with two outstanding undergraduate trumpet players:

Rolf Smedvig and Richard Raffio.

Richard Raffio went on to become the principal trumpet in the Radio City Music Hall orchestra and played in the orchestras of many Broadway shows.

Rolf Smedvig became the principal trumpet of the Boston Symphony Orchestra in 1979--while still in his 20s! He went on to found the **Empire Brass**, which recorded over 20 LP/CDs.

The Empire Brass featured the virtuoso tuba player Sam Pilafian (see my earlier Boston Pops entry). Sam and I both went to the same high school, Coral Gables HS, in southern Florida. Sam graduated a year before I started attending CGHS in my junior year. Even so, Sam sought me out while at Boston University to encourage my music career. It was a kindness I'll never forget.

CLOSE, but no cigar...

Outstanding musicians I've met and had a conversation with..., but not seen perform live.

Wynton Marsalis: I sat next to him on a plane flight from Boston to Detroit! He had met Rolf Smedvig at Tanglewood and was surprised to sit next to another brass player. A real thrill for me.

Mick Fleetwood: He visited my company HQ to endorse a portable sound system of ours. He used it while touring with Fleetwood Mac.
